

Our finances: an overview

Full details follow in Appendix A.

Income

Our 2002 financial operations produced a surplus of \$85 million – more than double the \$37 million outcome of the previous year.

Revenue from fees and charges, particularly tuition fees paid by larger numbers of international students, was \$98.77 million – 19 percent more than in 2001. This included \$7 million in fees from students using the new Postgraduate Education Loan Scheme (page 32).

The Queensland Government provided \$20 million for various building and other projects (page 22) including the Institute for Molecular Bioscience and the UQ Centre (pages 22, 25, 28).

We derived 58 percent of total income from outside sources – up from 56 percent in the previous year. We are now well on the way to achieving our goal of 60 percent non-government income by 2006.

Our Operating Budget represented about 45 percent of our total income. It supported major teaching and research activities and associated services. We derived the remainder of our income from:

- > specific research grants and contracts;
- > provision of services to the community; and
- > funds for scholarships, prizes, and other special purposes nominated by donors.

We were again active in direct fund-raising and enjoyed significant financial support in the form of gifts, donations and bequests (pages 42, 47, 50).

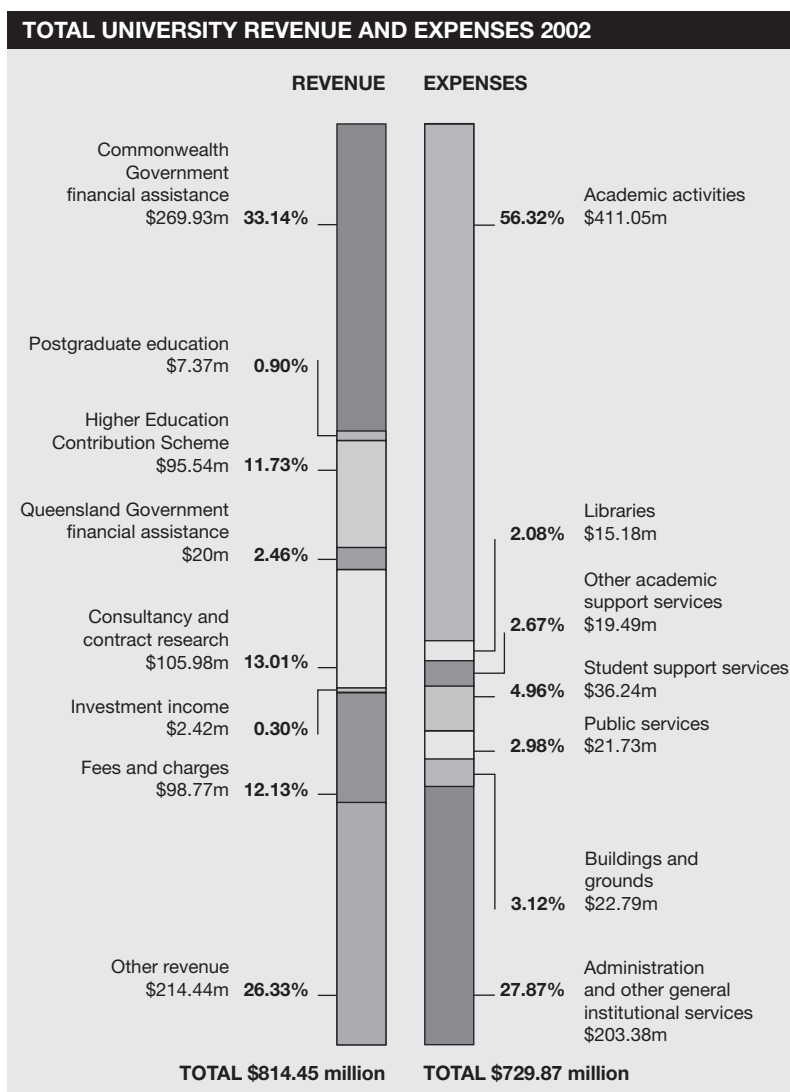
Expenditure

We determined our operating result after capitalising property, plant and equipment (\$139 million) less depreciation (\$52.4 million).

Although our Operating Budget income exceeded actual expenditure by \$20.1 million during 2002, expenditure commitments totalled \$33.1 million

against budget allocations at the end of the year.

After adding the cumulative budget deficit brought forward from 2001, the operating budget for 2002 showed a deficit of \$20.7 million. We will reduce this deficit to \$15 million over the next three years.



Our finances: an overview

Our investments

Our investment policy is to earn a rate of return allowing a long-term distribution of 4.5 percent of the initial value of the portfolio, indexed to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all future years.

This year we changed the management of our long-term portfolio by appointing four specialist investment managers and altering asset allocation benchmarks. These managers succeeded a single manager (Invesco) mid-year with separate responsibilities for investments in

- > Australian shares,
- > overseas shares,

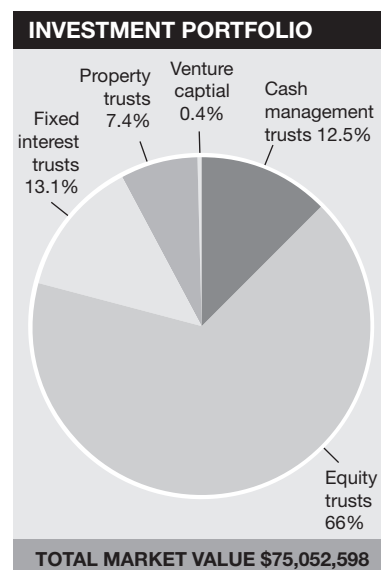
- > private equity, and
- > listed property, fixed interest and cash.

Overall returns by all managers for the year was -7.6 percent compared with the benchmark return of -7.8 percent.

Asset allocation benchmarks were

- > Australian shares 40 percent,
- > overseas shares 29 percent,
- > listed property seven percent, and
- > fixed interest and cash 24 percent.

Our long-term investment portfolio had a market value of \$75 million at the end of 2002.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2002

NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with the Financial Management Standard, issued under Section 46L of the *Financial Administration and Audit Act 1997*, applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Unless otherwise indicated, all amounts are shown rounded to the nearest thousand dollars.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the economic entity in the preparation of the financial report.

(a) Reporting format

In accordance with the Financial Management Standard, the University prepares a statement of financial performance, statement of financial position and statement of cash flows in the prescribed format. This format is consistent with the instructions for the preparation of annual financial reports by Australian higher education institutions issued by the Department of Education, Science & Training (DEST).

(b) Comparative figures

Where necessary, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation in the current year.

(c) Principles of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements combine the financial statements of all the entities that comprise the economic entity, being The University of Queensland (parent) and its controlled entities as defined

in AAS 24. The entities controlled by The University of Queensland are set out in Note 26. The effects of all material transactions between entities included in the consolidated accounts have been eliminated in full.

(d) Valuation of non-current physical assets

From 1 January 2002 land, buildings, infrastructure and heritage and cultural assets, including the museum collections and the Fryer Library collection are measured at fair value in accordance with AASB1041 – Revaluation of Non-Current Assets and Queensland Treasury’s Non-Current Asset Accounting Guidelines for the Queensland Public Sector”. All other non-current assets including plant and equipment and intangibles are measured at cost.

Non-current physical assets measured at fair value that are above determined revaluation thresholds are comprehensively revalued at least once every five years with interim valuations, using appropriate indices, being otherwise performed on an annual basis. Revaluation amounts relating to assets measured at fair value that have been disposed of are transferred from an asset revaluation to an asset realisation reserve.

■ Land

Rateable land was valued in 2002 at unimproved value as recorded by the Department of Natural Resources and Mines, with the exception of two parcels against which an appeal to the Land Court has been lodged. The University considers that the valuations assigned to the parcels in question are excessive and do not properly assess the limited uses of the properties. The valuations increased the value of those two parcels from \$18.6 million to \$51.5 million. A number of small parcels of non-rateable land were independently

valued by Australia Pacific Valuers Pty Ltd in 2002.

■ Buildings

Buildings were independently valued by Australia Pacific Valuers Pty Ltd in 2002 at net current value, which is gross current value less accumulated depreciation calculated to reflect the consumed or expired service potential of the asset. Gross current value is assessed as current market value where a depth in market can be identified or as replacement cost where no depth in market can be established. The asset recognition threshold is \$5,000.

■ Buildings under construction

Buildings under construction are shown at a value that recognises the extent of completion of construction work, as represented by progress payments to date. Contracts signed for the purpose of building projects that have not been completed at 31 December 2002 have been disclosed as capital expenditure commitments (refer Note 23).

■ Plant & equipment

Motor vehicles, computing equipment and other plant and equipment are valued at cost. The asset recognition threshold is \$1,000. Leasehold improvements are also valued at cost and are included with plant and equipment.

■ Library collections

The Fryer Library collection has been valued by management relying on an independent valuation of monographs and periodicals conducted in 1997 and internal valuations of other items and subsequent additions to the collection based on average prices. After discussion with the Queensland Audit Office the Research Library collection is valued at cost. The asset recognition threshold is \$1.

■ Museums & other collections (including Works of Art)

The University Art Museum collection has been valued by management relying on internal and independent valuations, that are based on market prices and actual cost in relation to acquisitions. The other museum collections have been valued by management relying on previous independent valuations and valuing subsequent acquisitions and donated items at cost and market value respectively. The asset recognition threshold is \$1 per collection.

■ Infrastructure Assets

Infrastructure assets were independently valued by Australia Pacific Valuers Pty Ltd in 2002 at net current value, which is gross current value less accumulated depreciation calculated to reflect the consumed or expired service potential of the asset. Gross current value is assessed as current market value where a depth in market can be identified or as replacement cost where no depth in market can be established. In respect of infrastructure the asset recognition threshold is \$1 per site.

■ Heritage Assets

Heritage assets that provide operational service to the University are reported as part of the generic asset class to which they belong and are recognised on the basis applying to assets that have the same functionality.

(e) Depreciation of property, plant & equipment

Items of property, plant & equipment other than land, buildings under construction, motor vehicles, library collections, museums and other collections (including works of art) are depreciated over their estimated economic useful lives using the straight line

method. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over, either the unexpired period of the lease or the useful lives of the improvements, whichever is the shorter.

The depreciation rates used are:

Buildings	2.5%
Computing Equipment	20%
Other Plant & Equipment	10%
Infrastructure Assets	5%

The Research Library collection is not depreciated because the nature of the collection is such that its value does not diminish over time and with use. The University has a well-established collection development policy that clearly states that material added to the collection is to be kept permanently. To that end the collection is maintained and cared for through being held in temperature controlled purpose built facilities. The material is fully accessible at all times.

After discussion with the Queensland Audit Office it was agreed to review the matter of depreciation of the Research Library collection in 2003.

(f) Translation of foreign currency transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are initially measured and brought to account at the rate of exchange in effect at the date of each transaction. Foreign currency monetary items outstanding at balance date have been translated at the spot rate current at balance date. Exchange differences relating to monetary items have been brought to account in the statement of financial performance in the financial year in which the exchange rates change.

(g) Inventories

Inventories are valued at cost using the first-in-first-out or weighted average cost formula. Direct costs and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead expenses are included, where applicable. Those stores held by the University are essentially for internal use. Livestock is held for teaching and research purposes.

(h) Land held for resale

Land held for resale is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes costs of acquisition, borrowing costs and holding costs until sale of the land. Borrowing costs and holding costs incurred after sale are expensed.

(i) Investments

Investments are valued at acquisition cost. Investments in entities that are not controlled by the University are included in "Other Financial Assets" (refer Note 10) in the statement of financial position and interest and dividend income only is included in the statement of financial performance. The Managed Investment Portfolio earned a return of (3.3%) (2001 – 8.5%). Other non-cash equivalent investments had an average interest rate of 4.9% (2001 – 4.5%) and an average maturity of 98 days (2001 – 111 days).

(j) Intangible assets

Product development costs have been capitalised in accordance with AAS or US Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) and will be amortised upon commercial release of the product. Other intangibles are carried at cost and amortised over their useful lives on a straight line basis. Useful life is generally 3 years, except for organisation costs associated with an overseas subsidiary which are amortised over 5 years and system development costs which are amortised over 8 years.

(k) Employee entitlements and superannuation

Liabilities in respect of employee entitlements that are expected to be paid or settled within 12 months of balance date are accrued at nominal amounts calculated on the basis of current salary rates. Liabilities in respect of employee entitlements that are *not* expected to be paid or settled within that period are accrued at the present value of expected future payments. Present val-

ues are calculated using the rate applicable to government guaranteed securities with similar maturity terms and estimated future salary increases.

The group contributes to a number of superannuation plans that provide benefits to employees and these contributions are expensed as incurred.

(l) Bad debts

All bad debts are written off in the year in which they are recognised and are charged against the statement of financial performance. The group has established provisions for doubtful debts that take into account any doubts as to the collectability of debts. The balances of these provisions are set out in Note 8.

(m) Net fair value of financial assets and liabilities

The net fair value of receivables (refer Note 8), other assets (refer Note 11), creditors (refer Note 14), interest bearing liabilities (refer Note 15) and other liabilities (refer Note 17) approximate their carrying amounts. Credit sales are on 30 day terms. Credit purchases are settled on 30 day terms. The net fair value of investments is disclosed at a quoted market price, or where there is infrequent activity in a market, the market is not well established or small volumes are traded, at an estimate thereof.

(n) Interest rate risk exposure

With respect to financial assets, exposure to interest rate risk is limited to investments in fixed interest bearing instruments where interest rate risk arises from the potential for a change in market interest rates to affect the net fair value of the instruments, that is, a price risk. Price risk is managed by investing in fixed interest bearing instruments for relatively short terms, usually 90 days or less.

With respect to financial liabilities, exposure is limited to the bank loan facility of a controlled entity. The facility consists

of fixed rate, discounted commercial bills where interest rate risk arises from the potential for a change in market interest rates to affect the net fair value of the bills, that is, a price risk. Price risk is managed by selling bills for relatively short terms, usually 90 days or less. The weighted average effective interest rate applicable to the bills for the year was 4.7% (2001 – 5.2%). The facility is in place until 2009.

(o) Concentration of credit risk

Exposure to credit risk is limited to the carrying amount of each class of financial asset, net of the provision for doubtful debts, as disclosed. Current debtors include an amount of \$25,940,000 (2001-\$28,549,000) that is owed in relation to research undertaken by the University. Research debtors include various commonwealth, state and local government departments and bodies as well as numerous large corporations and foundations which are subject to general economic conditions and trends.

(p) Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the University and can be reliably measured. Revenue arising from the contribution of an asset is recognised upon gaining control of the contribution or the right to receive the contribution including grants, scholarships and prizes and donations and bequests. Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets. Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon delivery of goods to customers. Revenue from rendering a service is recognised only when the University has a right to be compensated, it is probable that compensation will be received, and the amount of revenue and the stage of completion of a transaction can be reliably measured.

All revenue received or receivable

arises from the operating activities of the University.

(q) Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand, at call deposits with banks or financial institutions and investments in money market instruments maturing within less than 90 days and net of bank overdrafts. Cash on hand and at call deposits have an average interest rate of 4.4% (2001 – 3.6%) and 4.6% (2001 – 4.2%) respectively. Short term deposits have an average maturity of 85 days (2001 - 83 days) with an average interest rate of 4.9% (2001 – 4.3%).

In addition, certain of the controlled entities' subsidiaries are liable to pay income tax under section 4-1 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*. CiTR Pty Limited is subject to tax under United States of America Tax legislation with respect to its United States' operations and its overseas subsidiary CiTR Incorporated.

(c) Royalty Payment Commitment

A controlled entity, Comquest Pty Limited, has entered into contractual arrangements with private investors to undertake a Syndicated Research and Development Program at The University of Queensland. In terms of the Syndicated Research and Development agreements, the company is obliged to pay a royalty amounting to the maturity amount of the Promissory Notes/Deposit Accounts with Indemnifier disclosed in Note 10, subject to reduction on a formula basis if commercialisation income is received before 31 January 2003. Royalty is not payable if the put option, as arranged, is exercised prior to that date.

NOTE 24. CONTINGENCIES

(a) Supplementary Benefit Payments

The University has a contingent liability which may arise in respect of supplementary pension payments to be made to some retired staff members or their dependants. These retired staff were members of a Staff Superannuation Scheme which was terminated in June 1984. Former members who had been granted supplementary benefits at this date continue to receive these benefits.

(b) Guaranteed Return

During 1999 a controlled entity, SARV Pty Ltd (SARV), entered into an agreement with the Delfin Property Group to develop and market the land held for resale (refer to Note 9). Under the terms of the agreement, SARV is entitled to retain a guaranteed return from the gross proceeds received, which are directly related to the land. The return will be received in half-yearly instalments over the ten year term of the project.

NOTE 25. OTHER DEVELOPMENTS

UniQuest Pty Limited

In 2001, UniQuest Pty Limited (UniQuest) entered into an agreement with Coridon Pty Limited (Coridon) wherein an unrelated third party purchased a licence for certain technology owned by UniQuest for the amount of \$17,500,000. This amount has been paid to UniQuest and is currently held on deposit with Citibank. The deposit earns interest which is reinvested. It is expected that the total amount on deposit will increase to approximately \$26,418,000 by 29 June 2008.

The unrelated third party has the right (a "put option"), at any time up till that date, to require Coridon to purchase shares in another company. Whether that third party exercises that right depends on a range of factors outside of UniQuest's control. If Coridon is unable to pay for these shares, then UniQuest must pay on its behalf. The amount that must be paid is equivalent to the amount held by UniQuest in the term deposit with Citibank at the time the right is exercised.

Due to the inherent uncertainty of these transactions, no asset or liability has been taken up in the financial statements in respect of these transactions.

Under the Superannuation Industry Supervision Act and Regulations, the net shortfall fell within the definition of an “unsatisfactory financial position” requiring review by the Actuary and the Trustee. The Actuary and the Trustee have confirmed that in their judgement the fund’s position as at 30 June 2002 was caused by short term fluctuations in asset values and that based on “best estimate” investment projections the fund is expected to return to a satisfactory financial position within the timeframe required by the Trust Deed. Consequently the Actuary and the Trustee have agreed that at present the existing contribution rates remain appropriate and no further action is required with respect to the shortfall.

The last actuarial valuation was conducted by Towers Perrin on 18 May 2000 as at 31 December 1999.



Scope

The financial statements include the consolidated financial statements of the consolidated entity comprising The University of Queensland and the entities it controlled at the year's end or from time to time during the year. The financial statements comprise the Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Cash Flows, Notes to and forming part of the financial statements and certificates given by the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor and Acting Chief Financial Officer.

The University is responsible for the preparation and the form of presentation of the financial statements and the information they contain. I have audited the financial statements in order to express an opinion on them.

The audit has been conducted in accordance with *QAO Auditing Standards*, which incorporate Australian Auditing Standards, to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. Audit procedures included the examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of The University of Queensland and the consolidated entity's financial position, and performance as represented by the results of their operations and their cash flows.


