

INTERNATIONAL TUITION FEES ADVICE FOR 2009

At The University of Queensland tuition fees are calculated on the basis of the courses you enrol in each semester. Within the program rules, students can choose from a range of courses to meet program requirements. As a result, it is not possible to calculate precisely the total cost of a program. The table below provides a guide to the unit cost of a course in each discipline area. Most courses are made up of 2 units. A standard full time semester enrolment consists of 8 units (usually 4 courses).

The cost of each course is calculated by the number of units multiplied by the quoted unit fee. For example, in 2009 a 2 unit course in Engineering costs 2x AUD\$1600 = AUD\$3200; and a full time semester of 4 courses (8 units) in Engineering will cost 2x AUD\$1600 x 4 = AUD\$12800. Your deposit payment will reserve your place in this program for the semester indicated in your offer letter. Any outstanding balance of fees must be paid by the Friday of the second teaching week of the semester. Penalties apply for payments after this time.

Tuition fees are subject to annual review and cost indexation. The above course fees are for students commencing studies in 2009 and will increase annually thereafter.
