## INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION SERVICES FOUNDATION YEAR

**The International Education Services (IES) foundation year provides a bridge between secondary school studies and undergraduate study.**

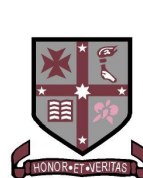
Students who achieve specified standards receive a Certificate IV in University Preparation and are guaranteed an offer of a place in the University of Queensland's corresponding undergraduate programs. The Foundation Year program is designed in collaboration with UQ faculties.

With enrolments from more than 40 countries, the environment at IES is truly international. Students study two compulsory and three elective subjects. Each academic subject increases confidence in communication and builds technical vocabulary and academic skills essential for success in

Australian tertiary studies. Because the average class sizes are small (20 students) IES is able to provide a high level of individual attention, fulfilling both the academic and social needs of the students. Intensive English language instruction designed specifically for international students is also provided. Nearly 30% of UQ's undergraduate international students commenced their tertiary studies after completing a foundation year at IES.

To apply, students must have completed the equivalent of Australian Year 11 or "O" Levels and must meet minimum English language requirements.
