

Statute No. 6

Fees

1. Short title

This statute may be cited as the *University of Queensland Statute No. 6 (Fees) 1999*.

2. Commencement

This statute commences on 2 July 1999.

3. Dictionary

In this statute —

“**scheme**” means a scheme of fees established by university rule made under section 6 of the statute.

4. Students to pay fees

Students must pay fees under the scheme.

5. No enrolment until fees paid

- (1) A person will not be enrolled until all fees payable by the person have been paid under the scheme.
- (2) If a proposed change in enrolment would incur an increase in a fee payable under the scheme or payment of an additional fee under the scheme, a change in enrolment will not take effect until all further amounts have been paid under the scheme.

6. Fee rules

Senate may make university rules to establish a scheme of fees providing for —

- (a) the fees to be paid —
 - (i) for examinations; or
 - (ii) for attendance at lectures and classes of the university; or
 - (iii) for the use of university facilities;
- (b) different fees payable under the scheme for different classes of students;
- (c) exemption of any class of student from payment of fees under the scheme;
- (d) reduction or waiver of fees in particular cases; and
- (e) the time and mode of payment of fees under the scheme.
