PROGRAM RULES



Master of Engineering

1 Definitions

In these rules—

partner institution means an overseas institution with which The University of Queensland has a formal agreement as an official partner with the Master of Engineering program.

2 Enrolment requirements

- (1) To enrol in the 32-unit program, a person must—
 - (a) either—
 - (i) hold an approved degree in engineering and in the relevant field of study for which they wish to enrol; or
 - (ii) have successfully completed at least three years of study towards an approved program at a partner institution; and
 - (b) satisfy the executive dean, that based on their academic record, they are suitably qualified for admission.
- (2) To enrol in the 48-unit program, a person must—
 - (a) hold an approved degree or equivalent in engineering or a relevant field of study; and
 - (b) satisfy the executive dean, that based on their academic record, they are suitably qualified for admission.

3 Field of study

A student must undertake the program in an approved field of study.

4 Program requirements

- (1) To complete the 32-unit program, a student must complete 32 units of courses in accordance with the ME course list for the enrolled field of study.
- (2) To complete the 48-unit program, a student must complete 48 units of courses in accordance with the ME course list for the enrolled field of study.

5 Maximum credit for other study

- (1) For a student enrolled in the 32-unit program, the maximum credit that the associate dean (academic) may grant for previous study is 16 units.
- (2) For a student enrolled in the 48-unit program, the maximum credit that the associate dean (academic) may grant for previous study is 24 units.

6 Special rules

6.1 Professional practice

A student must—

- (a) complete 450 hours of professional practice approved by the executive dean; and
- (b) satisfactorily complete assessment pertaining to that professional practice as determined by the executive dean.

6.2 Award of the Graduate Certificate in Engineering

A student who withdraws from the program after completing 8 units from the ME course list may be awarded a Graduate Certificate in Engineering with an undeclared field of study.

6.3 Award of the Graduate Diploma in Engineering

A student who withdraws from the program after completing 16 units from the ME course list may be awarded a Graduate Diploma in Engineering in the relevant field.
