

Master of International Commercial Law / Master of Commerce

1 Definitions

In these rules—

MICLaw means the Master of International Commercial Law.

MCom (24 units) means the Master of Commerce (24 units).

2 Enrolment requirements

To enrol in the program, a person must meet the entry requirements for both the MICLaw and MCom (24 units) programs.

3 Field of study

The executive dean may approve study in a particular field of the MCom only if the student has not previously studied in that field.

4 Program requirements

To complete the program, a student must complete 32 units, comprising—

- (a) 12 units from part A of the MCom (24 units) course list in an approved field; and
- (b) 16 units from part A of the MICLaw course list excluding any courses counted towards rule 4 (a); and
- (c) 4 units from part A or part B of the MCom (24 units) course list, excluding any courses counted towards rule 4 (a).

5 Maximum credit for other studies

The maximum credit that the associate dean (academic) may grant to a student for other study is 16 units.

6 Concurrent enrolment

A student must maintain concurrent enrolment in both constituent degree programs.

Note A dual degree is a single program of study leading to the award of two degrees. A student is not permitted to graduate with one degree and continue enrolment in the program.
