- ❖ #32 from Part A and/or Part B of the BA List including either–
 - Two majors of #16 each; or
 - One extended major of #24 (#28 Psychology) plus balance in BA List electives; or
 - One major of #16 and two minors of #8 each (a minor consists of #8 in total, chosen from one major list, with a maximum of #4 at introductory level and must include one gateway course and one cornerstone course).
