- You must complete a total of #68 for the program.

Bachelor of Business Management Section Requirements:

- ❖ #36 from the BBusMan List including –
 - #24 of compulsory courses from Group 1; and
 - Either:
 - #12 from one major in Group 2 (minimum #6 must be at level 3); OR
 - #12 of elective courses from Group 3 (minimum #6 must be at level 3, and maximum #2 may be at level 1).

Bachelor of Journalism Section Requirements:

- ❖ #32 from the BJ List including –
 - #16 from Group 1
 - #16 from Group 2 (Group 2 is split up with #12 and the other #4 are dependent on a student's GPA)
