PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete a total of #68 for the program.

Bachelor of Commerce Section Requirements:

- ✤ #36 from the BCom List including
 - #24 of compulsory courses from Group 1; and
 - #12 from one major in Group 2 (#6 must be at level 3); or
 - #12 of elective courses from Group 3 (#6 must be at level 3, and only #2 may be at level 1).

Bachelor of Science Section Requirements:

- ✤ #32 from Part A and B of the BSc list including:
 - #6 from Part A (Level 1 courses); and
 - #14 from Part B (including #12 of Late year).
 - #12 from Part A or B not included above.
- Students must complete either one major (#6 Level 2 and #8 Level 3) or an extended or dual major (#10 Level 2 and #12 Late year).
