PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete a total of 80 units for the program.

Bachelor of Music (Honours) Requirements:

- 48 units from the BMus (Hons) List, comprising:
 - o 26 units for Part A; and
 - o 12 units from Part B; and
 - o 10 units from Part C.

Bachelor of Science Requirements:

- 32 units from Part A and B of the BSc list including:
 - o 6 units from Part A (Level 1 courses) including SCIE1000 and STAT1201;
 - o 14 units from Part B; and
 - o 12 units from Part A or Part B or a combination of both.
- Students must complete a minimum of 12 units of late year (Level 3 or higher) courses from Part B.
- Students must complete a single major (6 units Level 2 and 8 units Level 3), an extended major or a dual major (10 units Level 2 and 12 units Level 3).
