Important Information

- At UQ we refer to your degree as a program and a subject as a course.
- Most UQ courses have a value of 2 units.
- If you are a full-time student, you will undertake 8 units (usually 4 courses) each semester.
- A course can only count once towards your program requirements

It is your responsibility to make sure you complete the requirements for each component of this dual program so you can graduate with both degrees. You must follow the program requirements, including any additional rules, listed on the <u>Programs and Courses website</u>. This study planner must be used in conjunction with your program requirements.

Bachelor of Arts component

The BA program consists of 32 units comprising -

- 32 units for Two Year 7-12 Teaching Areas Option, or
- 32 units for One Year 7-12 Teaching Area and One Senior Specialist Teaching Area Option

Bachelor of Education (Secondary) component

The BEd(Sec) program consists of 32 units comprising -

- 16 units for all BEd(Sec) Core Courses, and
- 16 units for BEd(Sec) Professional Year Courses

It is recommended that Modern History topics should include Australian history and other histories where possible. Students should avoid concentrating on one country/region's history as a breadth of knowledge across ancient and modern history and country/region is required.
