An extensive range of UQ scholarships, bursaries and prizes are awarded on the basis of academic achievement and/or financial hardship. A number of scholarships and prizes are also offered by individual Faculties and Schools. The criteria for awards vary widely. Students must apply for some while others are awarded directly by the University. In many cases, they are awarded on the basis of results after at least one year's study at UQ.

Interested persons should apply directly to the organisations indicated to obtain the latest information and application forms. Please note, the list includes awards administered by the University's Undergraduate Scholarships and Prizes Office and other awards as advised to that Office, and therefore may not be a complete list – Faculties and Schools may have further information.

Scholarships available by application, for which Postgraduate Coursework students are eligible, are indicated as such next to the title of the award.

CENTRALLY ADMINISTERED UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

The University of Queensland conducts a major undergraduate scholarship round at the beginning of each academic year where the following scholarships are offered. Applications open in November of each year with a closing date of mid-February. Students may apply for any or all of these scholarships on the one UG Scholarships at UQ Application Form by indicating their order of preference.

Commonwealth Learning Scholarships (CLS)

Commonwealth Learning Scholarships are available to full-time, undergraduate domestic students enrolled as commencing or continuing students in a Commonwealth-supported place at The University of Queensland who are high academic achievers despite experiencing financial hardship. These CLS are offered in accordance with the Commonwealth Guidelines. The University will also give special consideration to Indigenous students to ensure that a fair proportion of available scholarships are allocated to this group.

Students should read The University of Queensland CLS guidelines before applying.

CLS consist of:

➤ Commonwealth Education Costs Scholarships

➤ Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarships

Features of both scholarships include:

- one-year renewable for a maximum period of four years, subject to satisfactory academic progress and the continuing financial disadvantage of the scholarship holder;
- available to Australian citizens, or holders of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa, who are full-time, undergraduate students in Commonwealth-supported places;
- selection based on academic excellence and financial need. Additional factors such

as educational disadvantage, membership of a specific equity group and/or significantly adverse personal circumstances may be taken into account;

- CAS applicants must have lived in a rural/regional location for at least 3 years prior to commencing current program of study;
- scholarship value is not considered income for tax or Centrelink assessment purposes.

Scholarship Value:

CECS - \$2080 per year for maximum of 4 years

CAS - \$4161 per year for maximum of 4 years.

UQ Excellence Scholarships

Some scholarship features:

- one-year renewable for the normal duration of the program, subject to satisfactory academic progress and continued financial disadvantage;
- available to Australian citizens or permanent residents who are full-time undergraduate students; and
- selection based on academic excellence and financial hardship.

Scholarship Value:

\$6000 per year for normal duration of program.

Group of Eight Scholarships

The Group of Eight, a coalition of Australia's leading universities*, usually offers four scholarships at each of its eight member universities per year to students with the drive and determination to achieve academically despite financial constraints.

Scholarship features include:

- one-year renewable for the normal duration of the program, subject to satisfactory progress. Following the successful completion of one year of undergraduate study, scholarship holders who gain admission, may transfer their scholarship to another Group of Eight University;
- available to Australian citizens or permanent residents who are full-time, undergraduate students, normally completing Year 12 (or equivalent) in the year of application and who have

undertaken no previous university level study; and

- selection based on academic merit and financial need.

Scholarship Value:

\$6000 per year for normal duration of program

** Group of Eight (Go8) membership comprises the Vice-Chancellors of Adelaide University, The Australian National University, The University of Melbourne, Monash University, The University of New South Wales, The University of Queensland, The University of Sydney, and The University of Western Australia.*
