## STUDY INFORMATION

The course details that follow provide information about the prerequisites, course content, units, assessment, contact hours and the fee group. All courses that are offered in the Academic Summer Semester are listed alphabetically by discipline. Undergraduate and postgraduate courses are listed separately.

#### Late Enrolment

Enrolments received after 17 November but before 15 December will not be processed unless accompanied by proof of payment of \$50 administrative charge. Applications received after 15 December will not be processed.

## Cross-institutional students

With approval from your home institution you may apply to enrol as a Cross-institutional student. These students undertake approved courses at The University of Queensland for credit towards their studies at their home institution. To apply to enrol as a Cross-institutional student you must lodge an *Application for Cross-institutional Enrolment* with the appropriate faculty by **30 October** to enable online enrolment via mySI-net by the due date, **17 November**. ## International Students

Why not take this opportunity to fast-track your degree? All the courses on offer in the Academic Summer Semester are available for international students. The student visa restrictions regarding full-time enrolment do not apply to the Summer Semester, so you can enrol in just one or two courses.

## Student Cards

You need an ID card for identification on campus, library borrowing, attendance at some classes and to gain entry to examination rooms.

Students who have already obtained an ID in 2003 may continue to use this card. If you are a new student for Summer Semester, you can obtain your card 1 working day after enrolling via mySI-net. Take photo identification to the Unicard service desk on level 2 in the Social Sciences and Humanities Library (Duhig Building 2).

## Examinations

Centrally administered examinations will be held in the period 9 – 14 February 2004. A timetable will be available two weeks prior to the commencement of the examinations. The University's rules relating to examinations/assessment will apply. Student card, driver's licence or passport must be brought to examinations. Students are reminded that they must remain in Brisbane to take their examinations at the scheduled times.

Special arrangements will be made for students with documented disabilities or who face short-term difficulties affecting their examination performance. It is important that these needs be communicated to the Examinations Section as soon as the timetable is available. Students of non-English speaking background (NESB) whose first semester of enrolment is in the Summer Semester may apply to Student Support Services for approval to have additional working time in examinations. Students with a disability or medical condition who require special examination arrangements should see a Disability Adviser at Student Support Services. Special (including NESB) arrangements will not be made after the last Friday of the teaching period.

Special examinations approved on medical or other grounds for students unable to sit during the scheduled examination period will be held in late March or early April.

Results will be available in early March. Further information can be obtained from Student Centres or by phoning the Examinations Section following the teaching period.

## Prerequisites and eligibility for courses

Some courses are available to UQ award students only and some courses have compulsory prerequisite and corequisite requirements (see right for explanations). You should read the Course Details carefully before enrolling.

In some cases consideration may be given for prerequisite and corequisite requirements to be waived, e.g. for students from other universities who have undertaken equivalent studies or Non-award students who may have relevant experience or background. Any student interested in enrolling in a course for which they lack the specific prerequisite should contact the relevant School for advice on eligibility.

## Explanation of symbols used in the course information details

**Unit (#)** Unit value of a course

**Pre** Prerequisite. Enrolment is not permitted in the course unless a pass has been obtained in any course listed as a prerequisite or any other prescribed requirement has been fulfilled. (Note: In some cases consideration may be given for prerequisites to be waived. See above)

**Comp** Corequisite. Enrolment is not permitted in the course unless the student has passed or is concurrently enrolled in any course listed as a corequisite.

**Inc** Incompatible. Credit is not given for the course if credit has been obtained for any course listed as incompatible.

**P** A recommended prerequisite, but not compulsory.

**C** A recommended corequisite, but not compulsory.

## Tuition Fee

The Tuition Fee listed in the Course Details is applicable to students in Fee Category C only. It does not apply to Category A (International) and Category B (UQ Postgraduate award) students. All students should read carefully the section on Fees and Charges (Page 8).
