The findings of the research are in *Children Australia* (32:4, 2007). She is on multicultural CALD reference group set up by Griffith University to develop a DVD teaching resource on working with CALD communities in Social work/human services. Currently she is employed with Multicultural Affairs Queensland as Senior Policy Officer. Previously she worked for 3 years directly with families and children from CALD background in child protection.
