It is expected that over the life of the Fellowship, the applicant will commit their time towards the program of research outlined in the application, however our understanding is that some contribution to the teaching program in the Fellow's area of expertise (be it undergraduate or postgraduate) would not be viewed unreasonably.</p> <p>The Fellowship guidelines indicate that Fellowship funding can be used for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • research costs • the salary of the fellow and other dedicated project research/technical staff – provided they spend at least 20 per cent of their time on the fellowship project. The fellowship funding can not be used to pay the salaries of administrative staff. • travel within Australia that is part of the research project, including attending state or national conferences.
