PROGRAM RULES



Bachelor of Clinical Exercise Physiology (Honours)

1 Program requirements

To complete the program, a student must complete 64 units from the BClinExP(Hons) course list comprising—

- (a) 32 units from part A; and
- (b) 32 units from part B.

2 Class of honours

The class of honours is calculated on the basis of the grade point average of the results obtained by a student in the first attempt at the 16 units of courses identified in the course list.

3 Special rules

3.1 Continuous enrolment

Unless approved by the executive dean, a student must undertake part B without interruption.

3.2. First aid and CPR certificate

Before the commencement of semester 1, year 2 of the program, a student must obtain and provide evidence of a valid first aid and CPR certificate and thereafter hold a current first aid and CPR certificate for the duration of the program.

3.3. Immunisation

- (1) Before commencing a course in which, in the opinion of the executive dean, the student may be at risk of contracting or passing on a blood-borne virus or other disease, the student must complete a schedule of immunisations approved by the executive dean.
- (2) The requirements under rule 3.3(1) may be waived only if—
 - (a) the student provides evidence of their status with respect to immunity against bloodborne viruses or other disease prescribed in the schedule; or
 - (b) approved by the executive dean.

3.2 Blue card

Before the commencement of semester 1, year 2 of the program, a student must obtain and provide evidence of a valid blue card and thereafter hold a current blue card for the duration of the program.

4 Transitional

A student enrolled in the Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science (Honours) who has obtained a place in the Clinical Exercise Physiology major will be permitted to transfer to the Bachelor of Clinical Exercise Physiology (Honours) program.
