

## Bachelor of Education (Secondary)

### 1 Definitions

In these rules—

*part A; part B; part C; part D* means the relevant part of the BEd(Sec) course list;

*practicum courses* means EDUC courses containing a practical component where students gain supervised teaching experience in a workplace setting;

*pre-2018 student* means a student who enrolled in the program before 1 January 2018.

### 2 Enrolment requirements

A student must enrol in this program as part of a dual degree.

### 3 Program requirements

To complete the program, a student must complete 32 units from the BEd(Sec) course list, comprising—

- (a) 16 units from part A; and
- (b) 8 units from part B; and
- (c) 4 units from part C; and
- (d) 4 units from part C or D.

### 4 Special rules

#### 4.1 Progression through program

- (1) A student must complete part A before enrolling in any course from parts B, C or D.
- (2) A student must complete all parts of B, C and D (if any) in 1 year.
- (3) Despite rule 4.1(2), a student may enrol part-time only if the head of school decides that the student has commitments which require part-time enrolment.
- (4) A student who fails to pass a practicum course will be required to show cause to the associate dean (academic) why enrolment should not be cancelled.
- (5) A student who is required to show cause under rule 4.1(4) must do so no later than 20 business days after being required to show cause.
- (6) A student who is required to show cause may be required to attend a meeting with the head of school of education.
- (7) Show cause applications will be determined in accordance with criteria set by the associate dean (academic).
- (8) A student who has been required to show cause may have conditions set on their re-enrolment by the associate dean (academic).
- (9) A student will not be permitted to remain enrolled in the program if—
  - (a) the student fails to show cause by the due date; or
  - (b) the student's show cause application is refused; or
  - (c) the student fails to meet the conditions set on their enrolment by the associate dean (academic)
- (10) Withdrawal without academic penalty does not count as failure to pass a course.
- (11) A student who is not permitted to remain enrolled in the program under rule 4.1(9)—
  - (a) may apply for readmission into the program no less than 12 months after their enrolment has been cancelled. The executive dean may set conditions on re-enrolment.

#### **4.2 No concurrent study**

While completing parts B, C and D (if any), a student must not undertake any other program outside the BEd(Sec) course list.

#### **4.3 Blue card**

At the start of the program, a student must obtain a blue card and thereafter hold a current blue card for the duration of the program.

#### **4.4 LANTITE test**

Prior to graduation, a student must successfully complete the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education Students (LANTITE) as set by the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL).

#### **4.5 Award of the Bachelor of Learning Studies (Secondary)**

- (1) A student who meets all program requirements for BEd(Sec) under rule 3 but does not meet the LANTITE test requirement under rule 4.5 may be awarded the Bachelor of Learning Studies (Secondary).
- (2) The Bachelor of Learning Studies (Secondary) is not approved for teacher registration in Australia.

#### **4.6 Transitional**

A pre-2018 student must comply with the requirements of rules 4.4 and 4.5.
