## Bachelor of Business Management / Bachelor of Commerce

## 1 Definitions

In these rules-
approved combination means a combination of courses approved by the executive dean; BBusMan major means an approved combination of 12 units from part B of the BBusMan course list of which 6 units must be at level 3;
BCom major means an approved combination of 12 units from part B of the BCom course list of which 6 units must be at level 3;
compulsory courses means all courses in part A of the BBusMan course list and part A of the BCom course list, not includingACCT1101 and FINM1416;
general electives means any courses, from the BBusMan or BCom course lists, or any undergraduate program, approved by the executive dean;
pre-2019 student means a student who first enrolled in the program before 1 January 2019.

## 2 Field of study

(1) A student may complete the Business Information Systems major in either degree, but only in one component of the dual program.
(2) To be awarded two majors, a student must complete the requirements for both majors, noting that where the same course appears in more than one major, it can only be counted towards one major.

## 3 Program requirements

(1) To complete the program, a student must complete 64 units comprising-
(a) 24 units for compulsory courses; and
(b) 12 units for a BBusMan major; and
(c) 12 units for a BCom major; and
(d) 12 units for either-
(i) a second BBusMan major; or
(ii) a second BCom major; or
(iii) a combination of courses from part B or C of the BBusMan course list and/or part B or C of the BCom course list; and
(e) 4 units of general electives.
(2) Excluding compulsory courses, a student must complete no more than 4 units at level 1 ( 6 units for students undertaking the Real Estate and Development major for full professional accreditation).
(3) Unless a different intention appears in these rules a student must comply with the program rules for both degrees.

## 4 Transitional

A pre-2019 student may choose to complete the program under the rules in force on 31
December 2018, rather than under the current rules.
