PROGRAM RULES



Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice (Honours) (BCCJ (Hons))

1 Program requirements

- (1) To complete the program, a student must complete 64 units from the BCCJ(Hons) course list, comprising—
 - (a) 34 units for core courses, and
 - (b) 14 units from program electives, and
 - (c) 16 units from honours research courses.

2 Maximum credit for other study

The maximum credit that the associate dean (academic) may grant to a student for other study is 32 units.

3 Class of honours

The class of honours is calculated on the basis of the grade point average of the grades obtained by a student in their first attempt at all courses that contribute to the honours research courses of the program.

4 Special rules

4.1 Progression through program

- (1) A student must not enrol in courses from honours research courses until gaining credit for all core courses and program electives.
- (2) A student must commence the honours research courses in Semester 1 only.
- (3) To enrol in honours research courses following an interruption to studies, a student must satisfy the associate dean (academic) and head of school that the student has the competencies required for undertaking further study in the program.

4.2 Award of the Bachelor of Criminal Justice

A student who withdraws from the BCCJ(Hons) program after completing 48 units for core courses and program electives may be awarded the Bachelor of Criminal Justice.

4.3 Continuous enrolment

Unless approved by the associate dean (academic), a student must undertake their honours research courses without interruption.
