

Bachelor of Laws (Honours)

1 Definitions

In these rules—

general electives means courses approved by the executive dean from any undergraduate program in the University.

pre-2017 student means a student who first enrolled in the program before 1 January 2017.

2 Program requirements

To complete the program, a student must complete 64 units from the LLB(Hons) course list comprising—

- (a) 40 units from part A; and
- (b) 16 units from part B; and
- (c) 8 units of general electives.

3 Maximum credit for other study

The maximum credit that the associate dean (academic) may grant to a student for other study is 32 units.

4 Class of honours

The class of honours is calculated on the basis of the grade point average of the results obtained by a student in the first attempt at all LAWS courses at level 2 or higher that contribute to the program.
