

Master of International Relations / Master of International Law (MIR/MIL)

1 Definitions

In these rules—

pre-2019 student means a student who first enrolled in the program before 1 January 2019;

pre-2021 student means a student who first enrolled in the program after 31 December 2018, but before 1 January 2021.

2 Enrolment requirements

To enrol in the program, a person must meet the entry requirements for both the Master of International Relations (MIR) and Master of International Law (MIL) programs.

3 Program requirements

- (1) To complete the program, a student must complete 32 units, comprising—
 - (a) 16 units from the MIR course list, comprising—
 - (i) 8 units for part B, and
 - (ii) 8 units from part C; and
 - (b) 16 units from the MIL course list, comprising—
 - (i) 8 units for part A, and
 - (ii) 8 units from part B.
- (2) Unless a different intention appears in these rules, a student must comply with the program rules for both constituent degrees.

4 Maximum credit for other studies

The maximum credit that the associate dean (academic) may grant to a student for other study is 16 units.

5 Transitional

- (1) A pre-2019 student must complete the program under the rules in force on 31 December 2018.
- (2) A pre-2021 student may complete the program under the current rules or the rules in force on 31 December 2020.
