PROGRAM GUIDELINES

• You must complete a total of 68 units for the program.

Bachelor of Economics Requirements:

- ❖ 36 units from the BEcon List including
 - 22 units of compulsory courses from Group 1; and
 - 14 units (with no more than 6 units from level 1 courses and at least 8 units at level 3) for either:
 - one major in Group 2 (6 units must be at level 3) and 2 units from group 3; or
 - o elective courses from Group 3 with no more than 4 units of non-ECON coded courses.

Bachelor of Arts Requirements:

32 units from Part A and/or Part B of the BA List including either—

OR

- Two majors of 16 units each; or
- One extended major of 24 units (28 units Psychology) plus balance in BA List electives; or
- One major of 16 units and two minors of 8 units each (a minor consists of 8 units in total, chosen from one major list, with a maximum of 4 units at introductory level and must include one gateway course and one cornerstone course).
