## ***PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:***

You must complete a total of 88 units for the program.

### ***Bachelor of Humanities Requirements:***

- ❖ 32 units from the BHum List including –
  - 8 units for part A; and
  - 24 units for the extended major in Western Civilisation from Part B.

### ***Bachelor of Laws (Honours) Requirements:***

- ❖ 56 units from the LLB(Hons) List including –
  - 40 units of compulsory courses from Part A; and
  - 16 units of elective courses from Part B.

**NB:** A student must take at least one of the following as an elective for the extended major in Western Civilisation:

- WCIV2700 Western Political Thought
- WCIV2800 The Rule of Law
- WCIV2900 Rights and Freedoms
