You must complete a total of 80 units for the program.

Bachelor of Journalism Requirements:

- ❖ 32 units from the BJ course list comprising –
 - 24 units from Core Courses; and
 - 8 units from Program Electives

Bachelor of Laws (Honours) Requirements:

- ❖ 48 units from the LLB (Hons) List comprising –
 - 36 units of compulsory courses from Part A; and
 - 12 units of elective courses from Part B.
