### **Exiting Early**

Students exiting early with one component of a dual degree must complete the single degree requirements of that component. Students will then be required to follow the single degree rules to complete the remaining component from that dual degree.

### **Program Requirements**

You must complete a total of 64 units for the program.

### Bachelor of Business Management Requirements:

- 32 units from BBusMan course list including—
  - 16 units for all BBusMan Core Courses; and
  - o 16 units for all BBusMan Business Economics Major Courses

### Bachelor of Education (Secondary) Requirements:

- 32 units from the BEd(Sec) List, comprising:
  - 16 units for all BEd(Sec) Core Courses
  - o 8 units for all BEd(Sec) Professional Year Core Courses
  - o 8 units from BEd(Sec) Professional Year Curriculum Studies Courses

The BEd(Sec) Core teaches issues pertinent to teaching and schooling and is completed in conjunction with the requirements of the BBusMan degree.

To ensure you are meeting the requirements, you should refer to the Program Rules found on UQ's <u>Programs and</u> Courses website for the program, within the 'Courses and requirements' button.

## **Program Guidelines**

This planner is intended as a guide only and is based on current scheduling of courses. Students should note that scheduling can change from year to year. You are advised to check the scheduling for the current year and contact the relevant faculty for advice if course scheduling has changed.

The Bachelor of Business Management/Bachelor of Education (Secondary) dual program consists of two parts. The Bachelor of Business Management (BBusMan) provides the content knowledge for two curriculum areas offered in schools, whilst the Bachelor of Education (Secondary) (BEd(Sec)) provides the skills, knowledge and practical experience required for teaching.

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The core courses of the BBusMan prepare students for teaching areas in Business (junior high school) and Business Organisation Management – BOM (senior high school). BBusMan/BEd(Sec) students must choose the BBusMan Part B major Business Economics to meet the prerequisites of a second teaching area – Economics (senior high school).

Please note: if you are admitted into this dual degree program mid-year or obtain partial credit you will need to ensure that you structure your program so that you are able to enter the final year of BEd(Sec) component in semester one – the final year of the BEd(Sec) program is a year-long professional year commencing in semester 1 only.
