<u>Please note:</u> Students exiting early with one component of a dual program must complete the single program requirements of that component. Students will then be required to follow the single program requirements to complete the remaining component from that dual program and maximum credit rules will apply.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete 80 units, comprising -

- 32 units from the BEcon component, including -
 - 16 units for all BEcon Core Courses; and either
 - 16 units for one BEcon major (8 units must be at level 3); or
 - 16 units from BEcon Flexible Core Courses (8 units must be at level 3); and
- 48 units from the LLB(Hons) component, including -
 - 36 units from LLB(Hons) Core Courses; and
 - 12 units from LLB(Hons) Flexible Core Courses
