Selecting Plans in mySI-net

You may need to amend this study planner depending on the plan(s) that you have chosen to study.

Exiting Early

Students exiting early with the Bachelor of Business Management component of the dual program must complete the single program requirements of that component. Please note that the Bachelor of Education (Secondary) can only be completed as a component of a dual program.

Program Requirements

You must complete a total of 64 units for the program.

Bachelor of Business Management (BBusMan) component:

- 32 units from BBusMan List including–
 - 16 units for all BBusMan Core Courses; and
 - o 16 units for all BBusMan Business Economics Major Courses

Bachelor of Education (Secondary) (BEd(Sec)) component:

- Complete 32 units comprising
 - o 16 units for all BEd(Sec) Core Courses
 - 8 units for all BEd(Sec) Professional Year Core Courses
 - o 8 units from BEd(Sec) Professional Year Curriculum Studies Courses

The BEd(Sec) Core teaches issues pertinent to teaching and schooling and is completed in conjunction with the requirements of the BBusMan degree.

Please note that you can only commence the BEd (Sec) Professional Year Core Courses and Professional Year Curriculum Studies Courses in Semester 1 of each year, once you have completed all 32 units for the BBusMan component and 16 units for all BEd(Sec) Core Courses.

The Program Requirements outline the requirements to complete the dual program and should be read in conjunction with the course list for each component of the dual program. Please refer to the <u>program and course requirements</u> for more information.

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Program Guidelines

This planner is intended as a guide only and is based on current scheduling of courses. Students should note that scheduling can change from year to year. You are advised to check the scheduling for the current year and contact the relevant faculty for advice if course scheduling has changed.

The Bachelor of Business Management/Bachelor of Education (Secondary) dual program consists of two parts. The Bachelor of Business Management (BBusMan) provides the content knowledge for two curriculum areas offered in schools, whilst the Bachelor of Education (Secondary) (BEd(Sec)) provides the skills, knowledge and practical experience required for teaching.

The core courses of the BBusMan prepare students for teaching areas in Business (junior high school) and Business Organisation Management – BOM (senior high school). BBusMan/BEd(Sec) students must choose the BBusMan major Business Economics to meet the prerequisites of a second teaching area – Economics (senior high school).

Please note: if you are admitted into this dual degree program mid-year or obtain partial credit you will need to ensure that you structure your program so that you are able to enter the final year of BEd(Sec) component in semester one – the final year of the BEd(Sec) program is a year-long professional year commencing in semester 1 only.

Global Experience

If you are planning on completing an overseas exchange, you may have to amend this plan. Students who would like an exchange experience in their program are encouraged to seek advice from their respective faculties early in their program. Please note that you may not be able to complete Education courses on exchange and you may also be delayed in commencing your BEd(Sec) Professional Year Courses.
