

### **Important Information**

It is your responsibility to ensure that you complete all the requirements for each component of this dual program in order to graduate with both degrees. The following information is designed to help you plan your enrolment to meet this goal.

#### Selecting Plans in mySI-net

A plan is a prescribed combination of courses within a program being either a field of study, major, extended major, specialisation, minor or extended minor.

Ensure that the Bachelor of Humanities Western Civilisation Extended Major is correctly listed in <u>mySI-net</u>. If you require assistance selecting your plan, follow these <u>instructions</u>.

#### **Exiting Early**

Students exiting early with Bachelor of Laws (Honours) must complete the single program requirements of that component. Please note that the Bachelor of Humanities can only be completed as a component of this dual program.

#### **Program Requirements**

You must complete a total of 80 units for the program.

#### Bachelor of Humanities (BHum) component:

- Complete 32 units comprising
  - o 8 units for all BHum Core Courses; and
  - o 24 units for the Western Civilisation Extended Major.

Bachelor of Laws (Honours) (LLB(Hons)) component:

- 48 units from the LLB(Hons) List comprising
  - o 36 units for all LLB(Hons) Core Courses; and
  - o 12 units from LLB(Hons) Flexible Core Courses.

The Program Requirements outline the requirements to complete the dual program and should be read in conjunction with the course list for each component of the dual program. Please refer to the <u>program and course requirements</u> for more information.

#### **Program Guidelines**

This planner is intended as a guide only and is based on current scheduling of courses. Students should note that scheduling can change from year to year. You are advised to check the scheduling for the current year and contact the relevant Faculty for advice if course scheduling has changed.

#### **Global Experience**

If you are planning on completing an overseas exchange, you may have to amend this plan.
