

This Program Planner is for Bachelors of Music (Honours)/Bachelor of Education (Secondary) (BMus(Hons)/BEd(Sec)) students starting in 2024

Important Information

- At UQ we refer to your degree as a **program** and a subject as a **course**.
- Most UQ courses are usually 2 units in value.
- If you are a full-time student, you will undertake 8 units (4 courses) each semester.
- A course can only count once towards your program.

BMus(Hons)/BEd(Sec)Program Requirements

Your BA/BEd(Sec) comprises 64 units that you will complete over five years.

Bachelor of Music (Honours) (BMus(Hons)) component:

- Complete 48 units comprising
 - o 36 units for BMus(Hons)/BEd(Sec) Core Courses; and
 - o 2 units for BMus(Hons)/BEd(Sec) Flexible Core Course; and
 - o 10 units for BMus(Hons)/BEd(Sec) Research Courses.

Bachelor of Education (Secondary) (BEd(Sec)) component:

- Complete 32 units comprising
 - o 16 units for all BEd(Sec) Core Courses
 - o 8 units for all BEd(Sec) Professional Year Core Courses
 - 8 units for BEd(Sec) Professional Year Curriculum Studies Courses EDUC4645 and EDUC4658

Please note that you can only commence the BEd (Sec) Professional Year Core Courses and Professional Year Curriculum Studies Courses in Semester 1 of each year, once you have completed all 48 units for the BMus(Hons) component and 16 units for all BEd(Sec) Core Courses.

Core Courses teaches issues pertinent to teaching and schooling and is completed in conjunction with the requirements of the BMus (Hons) degree.

Exiting Early

Students exiting early with the Bachelor of Music (Honours) component of the dual program must complete the single program requirements of that component. Please note that the Bachelor of Education (Secondary) can only be completed as a component of a dual program.

How to use this Program Planner

This Program Planner assists you in drafting an enrolment plan to complete the requirements of a BMus(Hons)/BEd(Sec) dual as a full-time student over five years. Read the program rules below, then add the courses that you are required to complete for both your components.
