#### **Program Requirements**

#### **Program Guidelines**

#### Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (BE(Hons)) component:

- Students without Specialist Mathematics and/or another high school prerequisite may be required to undertake
  preparatory courses beyond the total units for the program and may not be able to complete the program in the
  minimum time frame without overloading or undertaking summer study.
- Students without Queensland Senior Maths C or Specialist Mathematics should complete MATH1050 before MATH1051.
- Students must complete a specialisation.

#### Selecting Plans in mySI-net

#### Course Scheduling

#### **Exiting Early**

Students exiting early with one component of a dual program must complete the single program requirements of that component. Students will then be required to follow the single program requirements to complete the remaining component from that dual program.
